Select 3 of the following awards that you are eligible for and email them to qrstf@live.com so that our judges assess your project for some great awards and cash prizes.

1. The City of Belleville/Elexicon Award

The City of Belleville/Veridian award is given to the project at each level (Gr. 4-6,7-8,9-12) that best demonstrates information or an experiment that pertains to fish/animals, their habitat, protection or invasive species.

2. The City of Belleville Municipal Infrastructure Award

The Prize is awarded to a project that demonstrates a subject matter relevant to a city, its departments and infrastructure. (gr 4-12)

3. TED ROGERS INNOVATION AWARD

An outstanding exhibitor or exhibitors with entrepreneurial spirit and a project that demonstrates commercial potential

4. Dennis Kritzer Computer Science Programming Award

This award is presented to a project that has developed (programmed) a software program that services a specific need. The program can be created in java, c++, or any other programming language.

5. The Albert College Engineering Award

The Albert College Engineering award is given to a project in Grade 6 that demonstrates the best principles of engineering. This includes: the design, building, use of engines, machines, structures, and being able to describe their importance.

6. The Albert College Life/Earth Sciences Award

The Albert College Life/Earth Science award is given to a project in Grade 6 that demonstrates the best principles of Life/Earth Science, including but not limited to: Behavioural, Botany, Microbiology, Zoology, Physiology, General Biology, Animal Behaviour or a project which deals with properties, origin, structure, composition or systems of the earth.

7. Quinte Conservation Authority Water Award

The Quinte Conservation Authority award is given to the project that best displays ways in which water or watersheds can be conserved, or protected. Gr. 4-12

8. Brain Injury Association Quinte District "Brain Wave" Award

This award is given to a project that deals with the brain, brain injury or safety.

9. Professional Engineers Award (4 to 6)

This award is for the best demonstrated use of engineering principles in a project. Grades 4 to 6.

10. Professional Engineers Award (7-12)

This award is for the best demonstrated use of engineering principles in a project. Grades 7 to 12.

11. Erika Jackson Environmental Award- Gr. 4-6

A grade 4-6 project in any category that demonstrates a creative approach to an environmental problem that could lead to cleaner air, land or water.

12. Derek and Kevin Sue-Chue-Lam Physics, Chemistry or Math Award (Gr 4-6)

A grade 4-6 project in any category that demonstrates a creative approach to a Physics, Chemistry or Math problem. (two awards)

13. Derek and Kevin Sue-Chue-Lam Physics, Chemistry or Math Award (Gr 7-8)

A grade 7-8 project in any category that demonstrates a creative approach to a Physics, Chemistry or Math problem. (two awards)

14. Dr. Stephen & Jean Kaladeen Life/Animal Sciences Award (grade7-8)

Best Life Science award. The project must pertain directly to the biology of an organism or the environment.

15. Dr. Stephen & Jean Kaladeen Medical Sciences Award (9-12)

The winning project must demonstrate in a clear and effective way an aspect of a development in medicine or health care.



16. Trenton Pharmacy Biology Award for Grade 7-8

Awarded to the best project in grade 7-8, which pertains to a biological theme. The project must directly relate to biology or an organism or the environment.

17. Trenton Pharmacy Biology Award for Grade 9-12 Award

Awarded to the best project in grades 9-12, which pertains to a biological theme. The project must directly relate to biology or an organism or the environment.

18. The Corporation of the County of Prince Edward Climate Change Award

The award is given to the project that best describes or develops an experiment that best explains an aspect of climate change that has an impact on the local area.

19. KKP Belleville - Best Display Board Award

This award is given to the best display/video in Grades 9-12 that shows clarity, professionalism, distinctiveness and innovation.

20. Michel Sarrazin French Language Awards

Best projects from French Language schools in the following grade groups: Grades 4-5; 6; 7-8; 9-12, & Immersion

21. Most Innovative Application of Technology Award

Presented to the project that displays the Most Innovative Application of Technology. Participants are encouraged to use existing technologies in a new or altered way to create a new or improved outcome. With little adjustment, or completely new application of something technical, the outcome can be minimally or substantially altered, or a new outcome created. The plaque will be displayed at the recipient's school until the next QRSTF and includes a cash award

This scholarship will be applied to the tuition fees when the student(s) registers in an undergraduate program at the Faculties of Engineering, Science or Health Sciences.
